

# SCHOOL BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT

## Relationship-based positive behaviour management

### Policy statement

#### **Covid-19**

In line with government coronavirus (Covid-19) guidance and support and the Health and Care Professions Council's standards of conduct, performance and ethics, I am able to continue to provide face-to-face tuition in emotional literacy for vulnerable children/young people (CYP) in the event of school closure, if school and/or parent/carer consider my support essential care for mental health and wellbeing.

I am fully vaccinated and take the following measures to reduce the risk of virus transmission, enabling CYP to engage with confidence:

- surface decontamination before/after session
- decontamination of resources and equipment before/after session
- room ventilation throughout session
- personal protective equipment in the form of a mask, when appropriate
- provision when appropriate of a visor for use by CYP
- provision of tissues and guidance to "catch it/bin it/kill it"
- table seating to support social distancing of 1-2 metres
- optimal hand hygiene, with use of good handwashing technique before/after session and use of anti-bacterial hand sanitiser during session
- provision of anti-bacterial hand sanitiser for use by CYP during session

In the event of my own suspicion or confirmation of symptoms of Covid-19 or exposure to the virus, self-isolation would be immediate, a test would be taken as a matter of urgency and the latest government advice would be followed. CYP's school and parent/carer would be informed as soon as possible.

In the event of a CYP's suspicion or confirmation of symptoms of Covid-19 or exposure to the virus, I would need to be informed as soon as possible.

In both instances, the usual cancellation policy would apply.
