In addition, I train school staff and BA, PGCE and Teach First trainee teachers in partnership with national charity Family Links, supporting its mission to develop emotional literacy and positive behaviour management skills to help school staff and pupils aspire, flourish and achieve, and since 2017 have worked one day a week as a PPA cover teacher at SS Mary & John C of E Primary School, Oxford.
